### CORRECTIONS

LOT 2 - Professional period filled and blended rear sight dovetail, repaired dust cover (flipped and new screw and serrations added), chipped guide rail on the right at the front.

LOT 9 - Manufactured in 1891 with non-standard "22 WRF" on top of the barrel. Fine overall as rechambered.

LOT 23 - This Model 1886 was once part of the famed Harold Argile McCallum collection (1911-2003). Along with his wife, Vernetta, McCallum ran a hardware store in Monroe, Oregon, from 1949 to 1974 which had gone by the name McCallum's Gun Store and Museum since the late 1950s. His collection had over 650 guns and included impressive Winchesters such as President Dwight D. Eisenhower presentation Model 1894 serial number 2,500,000, factory embellished Model 70 serial number 500,000 and the very first Grand American Model 21 to leave the Winchester Custom Shop. Perhaps most famous was his serial number 8 collection that was comprised of three serial number 8 Winchesters: the Model 1894 listed in the next lot, this Model 1886 and a Model 490. He was a charter member of the Winchester Arms Collector's Association with the fitting membership number "8."

LOT 24 - The initials "H.A.M" are for noted Winchester collector Harold Argile McCallum (1911-2003). Along with his wife, Vernetta, McCallum ran a hardware store in Monroe, Oregon, from 1949 to 1974 which had gone by the name McCallum's Gun Store and Museum since the late 1950s. His collection had over 650 guns and included impressive Winchesters such as President Dwight D. LOT 280 - Headline should read: **Very Scarce T. Jones Brown Bess Type Flintlock Musket with Bayonet**. Manufactured by Thomas Jones in London and possibly used by American militia.

LOT 282 - Headline should read: **Historic French & Indian War Era British Long Land Pattern First Model Brown Bess Flintlock Musket with Bayonet**. The Long Land Pattern was the main musket used by the British and their colonial counterparts during the French & Indian War and remained widely used during the American Revolution. This one appears to have been built during the former and is marked with what looks like "VERNON/1762" on the tail of the lock and has the Georgian cipher at the center.

LOT 437 - Scope not pictured in catalog.

LOT 475 - Headline should read: **RZM Marked Walther PPK Semi-Automatic Pistol with Holster and Knife**. Knife is a National Socialist Student League style knife marked with the circled "RZM/M7/13" on the blade, checkered black grip scales with swastika panel inset in the obverse, and a black enameled scabbard with frog.

LOT 517 - The consignor attributed the pistol as a war trophy taken from an unnamed German general and then kept in the family until present. Provided is a copy of a letter from noted author Alistair MacLean.

LOT 546 - Headline should read: **Desirable Fully Automatic Class III/NFA Auto-Ordnance Model 1928 Submachine Gun with Case and Accessories**. Includes an FBI style case.

LOT 583 - Includes an early pattern detachable operating rod spring housing.

LOT 590 - Description should read: As the Commander of the 21st Theater Support Command (TSC) (circa 2001-2003), he carried this weapon during operations in Bosnia, Macedonia and Kosovo, then again in Jan 2003, when deployed with the 1st Infantry Division, he carried this weapon in support of the invasion of Northern Iraq and also during the assault of Baghdad where the 21st TSC was in logistical support of the 101st Air Assault Division in the Mosul area of Iraq.

LOT 645 - Headline should read: **Pre-Ban Springfield Armory Inc. M1A Semi-Automatic Rifle**. The wood is fine with minimal light handling marks and is bedded. "TRW" barrel, bolt and operating rod.

LOT 649 - NOTE: This item is restricted as a National Firearms Act (NFA), fully transferable Class 3, which is registered with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, (BATFE) that is classified as a "Curios or Relic" as defined in 27 CFR, 478.11. These weapons are still subject to the provisions of 18 U.S.C. Chapter 44 and 27 CFR part 478.

LOT 651 - NOTE: This item is restricted as a National Firearms Act (NFA), fully transferable Class 3, which is registered with the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives, (BATFE) that is classified as a "Curios or Relic" as defined in 27 CFR, 478.11. LOT 741 - The barrel has magna porting.

LOT 765 - Headline should read: **Pre-Ban Springfield Armory Inc. M1A Semi-Automatic Rifle**. Includes a sling.

LOT 802 - Estimate should read: 4000 - 6000.

LOT 869, 870, & 871 - These 3 lots are part of a matching serial numbered set.

LOT 1111 - Headline should read: **First Generation Colt Single Action Army Revolver in Rare .45 ACP**. The cylinder is chambered in rare .45 ACP. According to Colt historian R.L. Wilson, only 44 first generation SAAs were chambered in .45 ACP. This revolver does fall in a serial number range of known factory .45 ACP chambered SAAs that were manufactured between 1931 and 1935.

LOT 1117 - The safety notch is worn down. Otherwise mechanically very good.

LOT 1171 - The box comes with a cleaning rod.

LOT 1225 - Serial number should read: 59331.

LOT 1242 - Provenance: Gary Garbrecht Collection, Ray & Sheryl Cheely Collection.

LOT 1244 - Description should read: Provenance: Ray & Sheryl Cheely.

LOT 1247 - Grips are ambidextrous double ribbon.

LOT 1285 - Headline should read: **Engraved Smith & Wesson Model 17-3 Double Action Revolver with Box.** Comes with a factory box numbered to gun.  
LOT 1429 - Binder also contains development history and details of the various Frankford cartridges in .45 caliber including drawings, ballistic design and dimensions, photos, Ordnance Department ballistic evaluations providing a near weekly testing and performance account that highlights the shortcomings of the .45 Special cartridge prior to the 1907 trials, and secondary sources such as Frank Wheeler's article "The Cartridge Collector" and excerpt from "History of Modern U.S. Military Small Arms Ammunition" related to the 1907 trials. The .45 Frankford Special had a brass rimmed case 0.923 inches in length, was loaded with approximately 7.2 grs. of Bullseye smokeless powder and had a cupronickel-jacketed, 230-gr. bullet. During testing the cartridge had a number of misfires. Nevertheless, the Ordnance Department "found much promise" in sidearms chambered in .45 caliber. The .45 Frankford was the experimental cartridge before the famed .45 ACP.

LOT 1434 - Receiver is marked: "INLAND DIV/0379".

LOT 1493 - Usually these company Presentation Carbine do not have any U.S. Government acceptance proofs, however in this instance this wonderful example does have a left-over or reject stock that does show a faint Cross-Cannon cartouche on the right.

LOT 1501 - OUT OF THE AUCTION.

LOT 1509 - Numbers are matching. The wood components are all in very fine condition aside from a crack in the rear of the angled foregrip.

LOT 1540 - Headline should read: Desirable Fully Transferrable World War II Savage Arms Corp Class III/ NFA Fully Automatic Registered C&R Model 1928A1 Thompson Submachine Gun with FBI Case, Drum, and Stick Magazine.

LOT 1579 - The included magazine is an experimental K43 magazine. This 20 shot magazine correctly shows no markings or date. Comes with 1982 dated correspondence between George Petersen and the individual who sold him the bandolier. Petersen expresses his wishes to use the bandolier in an upcoming new book, which became "Death From Above."

LOT 1670 - Headline should read: World War II Mauser "42" Code, "1940" Date P.08 Luger Semi-Automatic Pistol Rig with Extra Magazine, Holster and Takedown Tool.

LOR 1673 - OUT OF THE AUCTION.

LOT 1675 - Estimate should read: 1500 - 2500.

LOT 1696 - Headline should read: Guleazzi Signed.

LOT 1701 - OUT OF THE AUCTION.

LOT 1724 - The 28 gauge set is threaded for choke tubes and the .410 set has fixed chokes (upper and lower both marked "\*\*\*S"). The included .410 tubes are not compatible with the included .410 barrel.

LOT 1810 - Headline should read: Pre-Ban Springfield Armory Inc. M1A National Match Semi-Automatic Rifle with Box. Includes original box, numbered soft case, and data sheet. According to Springfield records, this rifle has a manufactured date of 8/3/1984 and was shipped as a National Match. "NM" marked barrel.

LOT 1812 - Headline should read: Pre-Ban Springfield Armory Inc. M1A Semi-Automatic Rifle. TRW marked GI barrel, bolt and trigger housing, and HRA/SA marked operating rod.

LOT 1845 - Includes original matching numbered box, extra magazine, take down tool, brass cleaning rod, original matching test target and instruction manual.

LOT 3017 - The serial number is stamped on: the right side of the loading lever.

LOT 3018 - Extractor is chipped.

LOT 3036 - Estimate should read: 2500 - 3500.

LOT 3275 - Cartouche pictured in catalog belongs with LOT 3274.

LOT 3277 - Caliber should read: .54.

LOT 3293 - Headline should read: Rare Prototype Barnekov-Greene Breech Loading Trials Carbine.

LOT 3317 - The bolt functions but the trigger will not fire.

LOT 3331 - Consignor states information personally received from historian Roy Jinks indicates this revolver shipped on October 25, 1902 as a single-gun special order item.

LOT 3407 - Headline should read: Engraved Gebruder Merkel/Stoeger Model 301 Over/Under Shotgun.

LOT 3410 - Includes 19 rounds of rare Kynoch 450/400 cartridges.

LOT 3557 - Chokes are full/full.

LOT 3573 - Weight is 6lbs 3 oz.

LOT 3591 - Stock is "duffle cut" beneath the mid band. Caliber should read: 475 Linebaugh.

LOT 3593 - Description should read: Serial no. 4976e, 8 mm Mauser cal., 22 inch round bbl., blue finish.

LOT 3597 - Headline should read: **Fine Weyersberg, Kirschbaum & Co. "Kaiser Prize" Damascus Presentation Sword Inscribed as an Honor Prize to a German Infantry Officer.**

LOT 3599 - Sword is marked "Echt Eisenhauer".

LOT 3685 - Headline should read: **Scarce Factory Documented OSS Shipped U.S. Property Marked Colt Model 1903 Pocket Hammerless Semi-Automatic Pistol with Factory Letter.**

LOT 3730 - Notarized letter of provenance included.

LOT 3746 - Gun 'A' headline should read: **U.S. Marked Ruger Mark II Semi-Automatic Pistol with Factory Letter and Box.** Comes with a Ruger box featuring an end label hand numbered to gun.

LOT 3776 - Gun 'B' headline should read: **Ruger MK II Target Semi-Automatic Pistol with Box.** With Ruger box and shipping box hand numbered to gun followed by "Ruger Navy .22 Auto."

LOT 3813 - Manufactured in 1927.

LOT 3839 - Includes Steyr soft case, four extra magazines, and case strap.

LOT 3846 - Headline should read: **Pre-Ban Springfield Armory Inc. M1A Super Match Semi-Automatic Rifle.** Includes a data sheet, sling, and a soft case stencil numbered to the gun.

LOT 3850 - Headline should read: **Desirable Jarrett Wind Walker Model JLM Bolt Action Rifle in .300 Jarrett with Scope and Case.** Consignor states the scope was custom made by Kenny Jarrett himself.

LOT 3908 - Headline should read: **Colt Government Model Rail Gun M45A1 Semi-Automatic Pistol with Case.**

LOT 3954 - Headline should read: **Korth Sport Double Action Revolver with Case and Extra Cylinder.** Manufactured in West Germany. Barrel dated 1984.
